

Michael H. Faber, born January 14, 1953 in Bonn, is a German Scientist of European Ethnology. He studied European Ethnology, History of Art, Cultural Anthropology, Pedagogics and Sociology. Faber works, as Deputy Director, in the Open-Air Museum Kommern – State Museum of Rhenish Folk Life, a museum of the Landschaftsverband Rheinland. Faber's professional skills are: Development and management of museum's events, exhibitions, media production, public relations & communication, personnel development.

In 1991, he was elected in the foundation symposium of the new ICOM Committee AVICOM in Paris as Vice President. After 2th election in 1995, he had the vice presidency until 1998.
