The project has several links to the goals proposed on the ICOM Strategic Plan,

- 1. Enhancing membership: a major event has the potential to bring awareness of the ICOM mission to a new public of museum professionals and boost membership among the Brazilian, Latin American and Portuguese speakers communities
- 2. Enhancing ICOM's international profile: the extensive network of professionals and associations involved by this initiative as well as the partnerships needed to the organization of such a regional-national event will foster further collaboration and possible agreements with National Governments and Museum Associations;
- 3/4. Raising the visibility of ICOM and Enhancing ICOM's international role:

Outcomes:

Although collecting is a central process for all museums and usually occupy an important place in their routine tasks and activities, few institutions in Brazil and in Latin America have organizational policies. The absence of directive planning regarding the formation of collections has a direct impact in the fragility or lack of consistent procedures and ultimately bring great problems to museum overall significance and sustainability.

Trying to understand this relations and their unfolding in the creation

process of collections are mandatory to help museums and museums professionals to understand their role and significance in a given society.

Strong links between ICOM Brazil and other ICOM committees in Latin America will be essential to broaden the debates, not only in the Brazil but also in other Latin American countries, which face very similar challenges.
