

A literary museum is a permanent institution open to the public, which acquires, conserves, researches, communicates and exhibits, for purposes of study, education and enjoyment, the tangible and intangible evidence of literature and its context, including its impact. Literature embraces: the work one or more writers; specific literary genres; specific literary epochs; books, and others carriers of literary texts.

Among the specifications of literary museums the following are the most relevant:

1. A writer's museum is a literary museum dedicated to one or more writers and their lives and other contexts, often in the more or less original house (writer's house) or apartment he or she was born in or had lived for some time.
